Did You Know? Earth Care is holding another Book Swap on Sunday, June 29. There will also be some books to take home whether or not you brought books to swap.

Our banners were created by African American artist/educator Steve Prince. The woman on the right is carrying burdens. Prince says if we aren't carrying these burdens, we need to be more thoughtful about the world around us and raise our awareness of care, including culture care. The church is called to join Jesus' offer, "Come unto me all you who labor and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) Another symbol within her corn rows is a

woman walking the fields. Prince hears her singing a freedom song, a song that continues through blues, jazz, hip hop and more. We are invited to look at cultures not through the lens of lack, but also through the lens of all that culture has to contribute. The man on the left is walking toward God in a posture of acceptance following forgiveness and contemplation. He is accepting God's call, the truth, and the role he must play. He can't carry it all and knows God takes that burden off of him. He accepts that God will empower him and give him the tools needed to make change within and in the world.
